

The Glenn Heights Community Center opened on January 17th. A summary of equipment, amenities, and hours of operation is referenced as follows:

Fitness Center Amenities: 4 treadmills, 2 ellipticals, 3 fitness bikes, 1 stair climber, 1 rowing machine, assorted free weights and benches, 1 Force USA G20 unit, 1 French Fitness X8 Multi Station Unit, and a group exercise room.

Additionally, there are locker rooms and showers that are available for men, women, and families. There is one Youth Room for children 6 to 12 years old. Computers and books are available for use in the Youth Room.

The gymnasium has a full-size basketball court with a drop down screen, volleyball / basketball / badminton / pickleball capabilities, basketball hoops with 6 adjustable heights, and a full walking / jogging track.

The facility is open Monday through Thursday, 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Friday, 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Weekend hours include: Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Sunday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

From Jan. 12, 2023 - Jan. 26, 2023 - Glenn Heights Fire Department responded to 64 calls for service: 47 for EMS and 17 for Fire. The average turnout time was 1:37 for EMS and 1:45 for Fire.

From Dec. 29, 2022 - Jan. 12, 2023 - Glenn Heights Fire Department responded to 71 calls for service: 50 for EMS and 21 for Fire. The average turnout time was 1:27 for EMS and 1:22 for Fire.

On Jan. 9, 2023, the Fire Department conducted in-service training on its new LifePak 15 cardiac monitors.


