

OpenGov is a government technology company that offers cloud software for public sector accounting, planning, budgeting, citizen services, and procurement.



REQUIREMENTS FOR SERVICE

- Heartworm prevention can only be prescribed after the pet receives a negative heartworm test administered by TCAP.
- We accept Visa, Mastercard, Discover, and cash as payment.
- All dogs must be on a tight leash for the safety of your pet and other clients and their pets.
- All cats must be in a hard-sided carrier.
