The City of Glenn Heights Fire distributed Thermometers to local businesses 17 sites were selected to receive devices

July 30, 2020

Glenn Heights, TX -- On Wednesday, July 29, 2020, the City of Glenn Heights Fire Department distributed non-contact infrared (NCIT) thermometers to 17 local Glenn Heights businesses to aid in slowing the spread of the novel coronavirus through the act of conducting temperature checks. The NCIT thermometers were provided to the City by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to support the phased reopening of workplaces and the restart of the American economy.

Workplaces with essential critical infrastructure workers and a high degree of person-to-person interaction received priority in the selection process based on guidelines provided by FEMA. The Glenn Heights Emergency Management team selected the following local businesses to receive the devices:

While temperature checks are not meant to be used as a standalone effort to combat community spread of the novel coronavirus, the NCIT measure is being implemented to help reduce the risk of virus reemergence in businesses with a high degree of person to person interaction. Additional symptoms that may indicate exposure to the Novel Coronavirus, COVID-19, include fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, body aches, muscle or joint pain, sore throat, headaches, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, nasal congestion and loss of taste and/or smell.
